What NNSA Checks For in CRADAs

- √ Fairness of Opportunity
- ✓ Conflicts of Interest
- ✓ Unique capability? Sensitivity of capabilities?
 - ➤ Simulation codes having UCNI. Run only on LLNL computers and by LLNL personnel
 - > Declare as Background IP for consistency
- Significant involvement from Participant
 - -SOW must reflect <u>collaborative</u> work
- More than one Participant?
 - -Multi-Party CRADAs need IP Management Plan
- Subcontractors?
 - IP Protection for Parties' Proprietary Information





Best Practices for Principal Investigators

- If you have to share proprietary information as you develop the INFUSE Proposal and SOW with the Participant, put in place a Non-Disclosure Agreement.
 - However, even with a NDA in place, avoid putting proprietary information in the SOW.
- Follow the format and structure of the SOW, so NNSA can focus on issues and not on the completeness of the document.
 - Background, Reason for Cooperation, Expected Goals, Technical Objective, Division of Tasks & Responsibilities, Phases of the Project, Deliverables, and Property
 - Remove any doubt for NNSA to conclude that this is a collaboration
- Work with IPO
 - To prepare the necessary documents to get in the NNSA's queue for approval, including Foreign Partner Review if needed
 - To answer all their questions required for approval
- Control the information to be used in, and to be generated by, the CRADA.
 - Anticipate the appropriate markings for each deliverable





Best Practices for Tech Transfer Offices

- Have the Participant complete the Business Self-certification form as the basis for Due Diligence.
 - Anticipate need for Foreign Partner Review, SAM.gov registration, etc.
- Check the SOW for completeness
- Check the budget sheets for consistency
- Check the Background IP List for any sensitive codes
- Work with PI
 - To prepare the necessary documents to get in the NNSA's queue for approval, including Foreign Partner Review if needed
 - To answer NNSA questions, if needed
- Weekly report to NNSA Field Office for CRADAs requiring NNSA approval
- Monthly meeting with NNSA Field Office to discuss general issues
